Entry is restricted to Members only, but any member who has another breed may enter this obedience competition if they wish.

SHOW REGULATIONS

- 1. The show will open at 9:30am.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10:30am.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry fees: first entry per dog £5.50 Members, £6.50 Non Members, subsequent entries £1.50 per class. NFC £2.00 per dog. Online entries can be made at www.onlineshowentry.com
- 6. No prize money will be paid.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under **four** calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 10. <u>Best Puppy in Show</u>: Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively
- 11. Best in Show: Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition)
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the

- exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. **DOGS IN CARS** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.
- 19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 20. The Society cannot hold itself responsible for accidents to exhibitors, exhibits or Members of the Public and it is on this understanding that entries are accepted.
- 21. The Committee is empowered to exclude or remove any dog that is not in a fit state for exhibition, from disease, vice, natural or other causes and if such exclusion takes place either before or after the dog is judges, the entry fee will be forfeited.
- 22. **DOG FOULING & GROOMING WASTE** Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling and grooming waste caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed event

and within the environs of that event including Car and Caravan Parks and approaches. Any organisation holding a Kennel Club Licensed event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members' classes or competing for members" specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **29**th **March 2023** wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- (1) <u>Withdrawa</u>l: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19.
- (2) Transfer
- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty- four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

<u>BABY PUPPY:</u> A baby puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

<u>Puppy</u>: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show

<u>Junior</u>: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show

<u>Post Graduate</u>: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

<u>Limit</u>: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

<u>Open</u>: For dogs of not less than seven years of age and not exceeding 9 years of age on the day of the show For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the day of the show <u>Special Veteran (7-9 yrs inc.)</u>: For dogs of not less than seven years of age and not exceeding 9 years of age on the day of the show

<u>Special Veteran (10 yrs plus):</u> For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the day of the show

<u>Special Open</u> Working: At this show, for dogs that have won 1st-4th Prize in any Obedience class at Limited, or Championship Shows held under KC Rules & Regulations; for dogs that have qualified and obtained a Certificate of Merit at Championship or Open Working Trials held under KC Rules & Regulations; for dogs which have won 1st-4th Prize in an Agility Competition held under KC Rules & Regulations.

<u>Brace</u>: For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of the same breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team. <u>Stud Dog/Brood</u> Bitch: For a dog or a bitch, accompanied by at least two of its registered progeny. The Dog or Bitch not necessarily entered in another class however, all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership.

Not For Competition: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed

NOTE: Puppies over 4 months and under 6 months of age on the day of the show, are eligible to attend, provided they are entered as 'Not for Competition'.

Limited Obedience Rules & Regulations

These rules and regulations are to be read in conjunction with The Kennel Club Obedience Show Regulations G under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with The Kennel Club G Regulations, available from The Kennel Club.

 Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed obedience shows must be registered at The Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.

- All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club authority to compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 3. Only dogs of **four** calendar months of age and over are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed obedience shows.
- 4. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
- 5. Entry is limited to members of the show society. A member may enter any breed in this obedience competition if they wish
- Dogs which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club are not eligible for entry at this show.
- 7. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
- 8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition i.e 4th April 2024 shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next class at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary or the show processor at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es). The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower class. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next class the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 10. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
- 11. Where dogs are entered solely in classes with a full running order they will be received at any time. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 12. For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to competition.
- 13. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
- 14. The dog should be led into the ring for judging with a smooth collar or, half-check collar, with lead attached (unless otherwise directed) and should be at the handler's side.

15. Animals allowed in Event.

No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board.

However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.

- 16. Following discussion between the chief steward and the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the show if it is:
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the show Incident Book and submitted to The Kennel Club.

- 17. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 18. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
- 19. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 20. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 21. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to The Kennel Club.

22. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and **at risk** if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

23. Welfare of Dogs

A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any obedience show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.

24. Food and/or toys shall not be carried or given to a dog under test except in Introductory Class where silent toy and food rewards may be used between and after exercises and in a special class if specified in the class definition. Competitors must not distract other dogs when rewarding their dog with food, toy or play. (Refer to Obedience Code of Conduct)

DEFINITIONS OF OBEDIENCE CLASSES

- Dogs are ineligible to compete at limited shows which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Obedience Champions are only eligible to compete in Class C at open and championship Shows.
- 2. A dog must be entered in the lowest scheduled class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another class if desired plus one additional class at the society's discretion.

PRE-BEGINNERS

To compete in pre-beginners a handler or dog must not have won two 1st prizes in either pre-beginners or beginners nor gained a 3rd place or above in any other obedience class. (Introductory class excepted.) and have not elected to progress on points from Pre-Beginners.

Handlers will not be penalised for encouragement or extra commands except in the Sit or Down tests. In these tests at the discretion of the Judge, handlers may face their dogs. Judges must not use the words "last command" except in the Sit and Down tests

The detailed tests will be:

- 1. Heel on Lead (15)
- 2. Heel Free (20)
- 3. Recall from sit or down position at handler's choice. Dog to be recalled by handler when stationary and facing the dog. Dog to return smartly to the handler and sit in front, go to heel all on command of Judge or Steward to handler. Distance at discretion of Judge. Test commences when handler leaves the dog (10)

Total 45 Points

BEGINNERS

To compete in beginners a handler or dog must not have won a total of two or more 1st prizes in beginners class, or one 1st prize in any other obedience class. (Introductory class and pre-beginners excepted) and have not elected to progress on points from Beginners.

Handlers will not be penalised for encouragement or extra commands except in the Sit or Down tests. In these tests at the discretion of the Judge, handlers may face their dogs. Judges must not use the words "last command" except in the Sit and Down tests The detailed tests will be:

- 1. Heel on Lead (15)
- 2. Heel Free (20)
- 3. Recall from sit or down position at handler's choice. Dog to be recalled by handler when stationary and facing the dog. Dog to return smartly to the handler and sit in front, go to heel all on command of Judge or Steward to handler. Distance at discretion of Judge. Test commences when handler leaves the dog (10)
- 4. Retrieve any article. Handlers may use their own article (25)

Total 70 Points

NOVICE

For dogs which have not won two 1st prizes in obedience classes. (Introductory class, pre-beginners and beginners excepted) and where the handler has not elected to progress on points from Novice.

Handlers will not be penalised for encouragement or extra commands except in the Sit or Down tests. In these tests at the discretion of the Judge, handlers may face their dogs. Judges must not use the words "last command" except in the Sit and Down tests The detailed tests will be:

- 1. Heel on Lead (20)
- 2. Heel Free (25)
- 3. Recall from sit or down position at handler's choice. Dog to be recalled by handler when stationary and facing the dog. Dog to return smartly to the handler and sit in front, go to heel all on command of Judge or Steward to handler. Distance at discretion of Judge. Test commences when handler leaves the dog (10)
- 4. Retrieve a dumbbell or dummy. Handlers may use their own item (15)

Total 70 Points

CLASS A

For dogs which have not won three 1st prizes in class A, B and open class C in total and where the handler has not elected to progress on points from Class A.

Simultaneous command and signal will be permitted. Extra commands or signals must be penalised. The detailed tests will be:

- 2. Heel Free (30)
- 3. Recall from sit or down position at handler's choice. Dog to be recalled to heel

by handler on command of Judge or Steward, whilst handler is walking away from the dog, both to continue forward until ordered to halt. The recall and halt points to be the same for each dog and handler. Test commences following handler's last command to the dog (15)

- 4. Retrieve a dumbbell. Handlers may use their own dumbbell (25)
- 5. Scent discrimination. The handlers scent on a marked cloth provided by the Judge. There must be a total six scent cloths, this total must not include any decoys, but must include the cloth provided by the Judge. These six cloths must be set out in a straight line which may be in any direction (30)

Total 100 Points

Progression on wins. Progression from each class will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in Regulations G(A). To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Open, Premier or Championship Obedience shows. A first place will count towards progression.

Progression on points. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to the next class, up to and including into Open Class C by gaining points at each level, using the Obedience Excellent scale of points scheme as follows:

- Ten points for first prize
- Four points for second prize
- Two points for third prize
- One point for fourth prize

If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary/chief steward signs the dog's Obedience Record Book at the first show entered in the higher class. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog or handler has progressed, they cannot return to the class that they had progressed from. All wins and places to fourth since 1 January 2019 can be included when calculating points. Points are specific to a particular class and cannot be used against a lower or higher class.

Points required for progression on points are as follows:

- 1. 20 points required for progression from Pre-Beginners.
- 2. 20 points required for progression from Beginners.
- 3. 20 points required for progression from Novice.
- 4. 30 points required for progression from Class A.
- 5. 30 points required for progression from Class B.
